Re: Minor Amendment D21/167763; RPI17/001 Mount Morgan Mine Site

In accordance with section 31 of the Regional Planning Interests Act 2014 (RPI Act), please consider this notice of a minor amendment application to D21/167763; RPI17/001.

The minor amendments will not impact any of the Environmental Factors or community values and the notification for feedback remains unchanged. The changes are as follows:

There are no plans to release the treated water unless the release is permitted under our existing Environmental Authority.



There is an existing agreement between the State and the mining lease holder that was appended to the original RPI17-001 approval (Phase 2 Agreement) that provides for the above activities within the Mount Morgan Mine Site.

Considering that this minor amendment is an internal property change (and that no comment was received following previous public notification), we do not believe that anyone other than the landholder may be impacted by the change and therefore do not believe that further public notification is required in this instance.

In addition, we would like to advise that Heritage Minerals conducted a Community Meeting on Wednesday February 22nd 2023. It was held at the Mount Morgan School of Arts Building where Heritage Minerals presented the project including these amendments to key stakeholders, community, local Council, and State and Federal politicians. The meeting was attended by the full Rockhampton Regional Council including the Mayor. The community expressed strong support for the project and there were no negative comments expressed at the meeting.

Accordingly, pursuant to Section 55 of the Regional Planning Interests Act 2014, we hereby seek the Chief Executive's approval to amend the updated RPI17-001 granted on the 28th of September 2021



MAP – HERITAGE MINERALS RESOURCE ACTIVITY FOOTPRINT (MARCH 2023)








MOUNT MORGAN MINE SITE
